## 1. Authority

This event is a Multi-Club Motorkhana conducted on the DECA Shepparton facilities, held under the National Competition Rules of the Australian Auto-Sport Alliance Pty. Ltd. "AASA". These Supplementary Regulations and any further regulations that may be issued. AASA Permit Number is: AASA140416/SAV2005

#### 2. Entries

- Entries with Direct Deposit Confirmation or a copy of deposit slip will be accepted via email <a href="mailto:deca@sauvic.com.au">deca@sauvic.com.au</a> or via the online entry form.
- The SAU-Vic committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without explanation.
- Entries will be accepted in order of receipt, on a correctly completed entry form.
- No entries shall be accepted from under 18-year-old competitors.
- Entry fee is as stated on the entry form (AUD \$120). Entries open and close at the times/dates as stated on the entry form. NO refunds will be issued after 5.00pm on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> May 2016.
- Personal accident insurance will be provided for all license holders
- Entry is open to members of affiliated car clubs.
- Entrants must produce their club membership card and current competition licence and Log book (if issued) at
  registration on the morning of the event. AASA day licenses can be issued on the day of competition. Payment of
  \$25 must be made in CASH to the Event Secretary only. Yearly licenses must be purchased in advance direct from
  the supplier.

### 3. Vehicles

- You must advise the organizers on your entry form of the designated car you will be bringing to the event. If this changes, you MUST advise us.
- Cars presented to the scrutineer not ready for competition will be denied entry to the event.
- Cars must be considered 'roadworthy' and will be subjected to an examination. (Scrutineering)
- Tyres must be roadworthy to enter the road events on the DECA highway circuit.
- Seatbelts must be fitted to the vehicle and must comply with the current Australian Standards.
- All loose objects must be removed from the vehicle
- Tyres other than designated road tyres (Slicks) may be used and times will be recorded but you will not be eligible for any awards
- Noise All vehicles must be fitted with an effective muffler which diminishes the sound of the engines exhaust. The
  muffler must be so constructed that the maximum vehicle noise emitted does not exceed 95dB(A) measured at a
  point 30 meters from the track edge by approved measuring equipment
- All vehicles must be equipped with a minimum 900gram fire extinguisher securely mounted inside the vehicle with a
  metal bracket. Extinguishers must comply with the Australian Standard AS 1841 and not be more than five years
  old.

#### 4. Apparel

- Competitors must wear non-flammable clothing extended from ankles to neck to wrists. Nylon clothing is not permitted. Shoes must be closed toe.
- Helmets are to be worn whilst competing. All drivers must wear a helmet that complies with current Australian Standards. (AASA Standing Regulations Section 2.11 (b))

Safety helmet - being those with the following markings:

- i. AS1698 Australian Standard
- ii. Snell SA95, M90, SA95, SA2000 USA Standard
- iii. SFI Spec 31.1, 31.2, 31.1A. 31.2A USA Standard
- iv. E22 (with 03, 04 or 05 amendments) European Standard
- v. BS 6658-85 Type A and A/FR (including amendments) British Standard
- If competing in an open top vehicle Helmet with full face visor, or helmet with goggles.
- Drivers of vehicles to which no windscreen is fitted shall wear adequate eye protection complying with current Australian Standard whilst competing

#### 5. Event

- It is your responsibility to bring the correct documentation with you to morning registration.
- Motorkhana courses will be selected by the Skylines Australia Vic Inc. Motorsport Committee.
- The organisers reserve the right to abandon, postpone or cancel the event without assigning a reason in accordance with AASA Standing Regulations Section1.4.
- In accordance with AASA Standing Regulations 2.43 any competitor or spectator found to be under the influence of alcohol or illicit drugs will be immediately excluded from the event.
- Drivers must obey flags, board signals, and any direction(s) given by our appointed officials.
- Protests, if any, must be submitted in writing to the Event Director in accordance with the requirements of SAU Vic Inc.
- Vehicles will not be permitted on the circuit after 4.30pm and must have vacated the complex by 5.00pm.
- Only one vehicle allowed on course at one time for road circuit & motorkhana events. A maximum of two vehicles will be allowed onto the skidpan during Battles, & must be traveling in the same direction. Do not enter the skidpan until instructed by an official.
- Maximum speed within the complex roads and pits is 10km/h. Please be mindful of spectators.
- No spinning of wheels between events. Offenders will be removed from the complex and competition.
- Motorkhana
- Further event instructions and scheduled times will be issued to participants prior to the event outlining the day's proceedings. This 'Event Schedule' will include maps of the DECA facilities and current motorkhana maps.

## 6. Passengers

- Passengers must wear approved non-flammable clothing and footwear, with clothing extended from ankles to neck to wrists. Passengers must wear closed leather shoes.
- Passengers must wear a helmet complying with the Australian Standard (e.g. AS 1698).
- A safety belt must be fitted in the vehicle for use by the passenger and must not require the use of any additional support to fit into seat belts.
- Passengers under 18 years of age must be countersigned / consented to by a parent or guardian. A guardian must have written permission of the parent or provides proof of legal guardian.
- One Passenger only will be permitted in vehicles during any part of the Motorkhana or special events. A passenger indemnity form is to be completed prior to the passenger entering the event.
